RESOLUTION 10-2022

Resolution of the Bay-Lake Regional Planning Commission approving Highway Safety Improvement Program 2023 Performance Measure Targets for the Sheboygan Metropolitan Planning Area

WHEREAS, the Bay-Lake Regional Planning Commission is the officially designated Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for metropolitan transportation planning in the Sheboygan Metropolitan Planning Area; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) established five performance measures for the Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) within the National Performance Management Measures: Highway Safety Improvement Program: Final (23 CFR 490, Subpart B); and

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) established statewide calendar year 2023 targets for each of the five HSIP performance measures in accordance with 23 CFR 490.209; and

WHEREAS, MPOs must annually establish calendar year targets for each of the five HSIP performance measures by either agreeing to plan and program projects so that they contribute to the accomplishment of WisDOT's HSIP target(s) or commit to quantifiable HSIP target(s) for the metropolitan planning area (or a combination thereof); and

WHEREAS, the Bay-Lake Regional Planning Commission staff spent some time in 2022 analyzing crash data within the Sheboygan Metropolitan Planning Area for calendar years 2017 through 2021 (with an emphasis on extracting and examining 2021 crash data and examining previously collected crash data from 2017 through 2020), with the analysis indicating that safety performance measure statistics in the Sheboygan Metropolitan Planning Area were below statewide statistics applied to the vehicle miles traveled (VMT) of the metropolitan planning area for four of the five HSIP performance measures; and

WHEREAS, since four of the five safety performance measure statistics in the Sheboygan Metropolitan Planning Area were below statewide statistics applied to the VMT of the metropolitan planning area (with non-motorized fatalities and serious injuries being above statewide statistics applied to the VMT of the metropolitan planning area), Bay-Lake Regional Planning Commission staff recommended supporting WisDOT's safety performance targets for 2023 (as opposed to setting independent performance targets), with greater education of motorists and pedestrians of all ages regarding safety issues in the Sheboygan Metropolitan Planning Area also being recommended; and

WHEREAS, approval of the HSIP 2023 performance measure targets for the Sheboygan Metropolitan Planning Area (and specifically supporting WisDOT's safety performance targets

for 2023) was recommended by the Sheboygan MPO Technical and Policy Advisory Committees at their joint meeting on October 27, 2022.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

<u>FIRST</u>: That the Bay-Lake Regional Planning Commission, as MPO for the Sheboygan Metropolitan Planning Area, agrees to plan and program projects so that they contribute toward the accomplishment of WisDOT's calendar year 2023 targets for all five performance measures, as follows:

- Number of Fatalities: 587.2;
- Rate of Fatalities: 0.937 per 100 million vehicle miles traveled;
- Number of Serious Injuries: 3,044.3;
- Rate of Serious Injuries: 4.857 per 100 million vehicle miles traveled; and
- Number of Non-Motorized Fatalities and Non-Motorized Serious Injuries: 364.0.

<u>SECOND</u>: That there be greater education of motorists and pedestrians of all ages in the Sheboygan Metropolitan Planning Area, as motorist-pedestrian crashes were the vast majority of crashes involving non-motorized fatalities and serious injuries in recent years, and led to an uptick in the five-year average in that performance measure
