The Bay Beach
Restoration Action
Plan is complete and
available for download
on the Commission's
website. This plan
was funded under an
EPA Urban Waters
Grant and provides a
strategy for restoring
Bay Beach in Green
Bay. It is the

culmination of three years of water quality research by the Commission, the University of Wisconsin - Oshkosh, and others.

Although Bay Beach occasionally experiences episodes of elevated *E. coli*, the water quality for recreational contact is comparable to other Lake Michigan beaches in Wisconsin. However, harmful algal blooms continue to be a concern in Green Bay and additional research is needed on effective monitoring techniques and management. Though many types of algae can form blooms, freshwater harmful algal blooms have the ability to produce toxins that are dangerous to other organisms such as humans, dogs, and livestock. Most harmful algal blooms occur in warm, slow moving, nutrient-rich waters in mid-June through late September and are formed by cyanobacteria (aka blue-green algae).

Based on water quality testing conducted as part of the Bay Beach Restoration Action Plan, no reason has been found to maintain closure of Bay Beach. Permanent closure of the beach resulted from pollution that is no longer allowable under the Clean Water Act. Other pollution such as PCBs and mercury are still affecting the Bay; however, not to an extent that raises any concern for recreational water contact.

Community Project Survey


